


# Cherry Hill Public Schools' Summer Reading Book Sale


***Flipped* by Wendelin Van Draanen

She says: "My Bryce. Still walking around with my first kiss."


He says: "It's been six years of strategic avoidance and social discomfort."

Her friends and neighbors are leaving, her oldest brother is speaking out against the North, and the likelihood of being reunited with her father — who has been missing in action for nine years — is growing dimmer. When Saigon falls in 1975, Hà and her family are forced to flee on a navy ship and, after spending months in refugee camps, end up moving to Alabama. There, Hà struggles to deal with everything from learning the language and customs to handling the bullies who make fun of her at school. Will she ever feel at home in this strange new land? And will she ever see her father again?



***Fish in a Tree* by Lynda Mullaly Hunt

Ally is smart enough to fool a lot of smart people. She hides her inability to read by creating clever yet disruptive distractions. However, her new teacher Mr. Daniels sees the bright, creative kid underneath the trouble maker. With his help, Ally learns not to be so hard on herself and not to be ashamed of her dyslexia.
